# Chalice User Manual

Welcome to **The Chalice** user manual. This guide will walk you through everything you need to know to load, use, clean, maintain, and replace screens for your Chalice to ensure optimal vaporization experiences.

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## Overview and Features

The **Chalice** is a premium glass bowl designed for use with **The Scepter** vaporization wand. Available in **14mm** and **18mm** male glass joint sizes, it features durable glass construction and **stainless steel screens**. The Chalice is designed to be capped and heated by **The Scepter** for efficient and flavorful vapor production.

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## Loading The Chalice

### Optimal Fill Level:

- For best results, fill The Chalice **between 1/3 to 2/3 full**.
- Using **less than 1/3** may cause uneven vaporization.
- Using **more than 2/3** can lead to excessive heat towards the top of the bowl, reducing efficiency.

### Loading Procedure:

1. **Grind your dry herb** to a medium-fine consistency.
  2. **Lightly and evenly pack** the ground flower into The Chalice using **The Apparatus's packer** or your fingertip. Be sure to pack gently, without applying too much pressure, to maintain airflow.
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## Using The Chalice with The Scepter

### Vaporization Process:

1. Place The Chalice into your **rig, bong, or waterpipe** with a **14mm or 18mm female glass-on-glass connection**.
2. **Cap The Chalice** with a pre-heated **Scepter vaporization wand**, ensuring a snug fit.

### Initiating Vaporization:

- Wait **5-10 seconds** after capping to allow The Chalice to heat up.

- Inhale through the mouthpiece of your waterpipe to draw vapor.
- Be cautious as **The Chalice gets hot** during use; hold it by the handle or slide.

#### Clearing The Chamber (Optional):

- To clear any remaining vapor, remove The Chalice from the waterpipe at the end of your hit.
  - Be sure to handle The Chalice carefully as it will still be hot.
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## Replacing Screens

#### Screen Replacement Process:

1. **Remove the old screen** from The Chalice and clean the bowl thoroughly.
2. Take a new **stainless steel screen** and pinch it gently between your **thumb and forefinger** to form it into a dome shape. The screen should resemble the shape of a **corrective vision contact lens** when properly formed.
3. Place the new screen into The Chalice with the **convex side up**, ensuring the edges of the screen rest along the lip designed to hold it in place.
4. **Gently push down** on the center of the screen to create a small depression or dimple. The screen will not sit completely flat but will have a slight curvature, which acts as a spring to hold it securely in position.

This curvature ensures proper airflow and keeps the screen locked in place during use.

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## Cleaning and Maintenance

#### Cleaning The Chalice:

1. **Soak The Chalice** in isopropyl alcohol to dissolve residue, agitating occasionally until clean.
2. **Rinse thoroughly** under hot water to remove all alcohol residue before drying.
3. Ensure the bowl is completely dry before your next use.

#### Maintaining Screens:

- Screens can be reused until clogged.
  - To clean screens, soak them in isopropyl alcohol and rinse thoroughly under hot water.
  - **Replace clogged screens** as needed following the instructions above.
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## Safety Tips

- **Handle The Chalice carefully** after use as the bowl area gets hot.
  - Always use The Chalice with a **rig, bong, or waterpipe** with a compatible glass-on-glass connection. **It cannot be used independently.**
  - Never attempt to clean or replace screens while the Chalice is still hot.
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## Included Accessories

The Chalice comes with:

- **20 stainless steel screens**
  - A **velvet carrying bag** for convenient storage and transport.
